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ABOUT LEADERSHIP GIVING Leadership Givers have a deep commitment to helping local people and make an annual investment of \$1,000 or more into our community through United Way of Greater Stark County. The energy, excitement and enthusiasm of these generous individuals inspires others and infuses hope into those who need it most. The Step-Up Leadership Program allows donors to begin giving at a \$500 level and be recognized as a Leaders in Giving donors while increasing gifts over a five-year period. (I.E. Year 1 donate \$500, Year 2 donate \$600, etc.)

DONOR NETWORKS

United Way of Greater Stark County has a way for every Leadership Giver to participate. Each donor network offers programs and events that are uniquely-tailored to its members.

- Alexis de Tocqueville Society (\$10,000+)
- Leaders in Giving (\$1,000 - \$9,999)
- Women United (\$1,000+)
- Young Leaders Society (No giving requirement)
- Labor CARES (No giving requirement)

IMPACT

When you contribute an annual gift of \$1,000 or more (\$38/paycheck), you are helping our community through a multitude of funded programs and services. A \$1,000 gift can provide:

- **92 sleep sacks.** In Stark County in 2016, 38 babies died in Stark County before their first birthday. Education on safe sleeping and sleep sacks are helping to reduce that statistic.
- **Almost one year of SPARK services for one child.** SPARK children outperform their peers in all early learning domains. In addition, kindergarten teachers indicate that SPARK children are more prepared than their peers and their parents are more likely to engage in their child's learning.
- **19 Stark County residents to attend a 2-hour money management class.** Money management courses can help families and individuals improve communication about money, values, goals, their approaches to saving and spending, and to take control of their finances through an approach that leaves nothing to chance.

GOLD DONORS
\$5,000-\$7,499 annually

SILVER DONORS
\$2,500-\$4,999 annually

PEWTER DONORS
\$1,500-\$2,499 annually

BRONZE DONORS
\$1,000-\$1,499 annually

The **STEP UP PROGRAM** allows donors to begin giving at a \$500 level and be recognized as a Leaders in Giving donor while increasing gifts over a five year period.

Year 1 - donate \$500
Year 4 - donate \$900

Year 2 - donate \$600
Year 5 - donate \$1,000

Year 3 - donate \$750

French philosopher Alexis de Tocqueville visited the United States in the early 1800s, and was impressed by the spirit of selflessness and cooperation among American citizens. United Way's Alexis de Tocqueville Society reflects this positive attitude of good will. It personifies the true meaning of philanthropy, with members giving \$10,000 or more annually.

Membership in the society offers a variety of networking and social events including the annual dinner. Currently, there are over 398 local Tocqueville Societies in the United States. Local members are recognized in the annual Leaders in Giving Book, along with national publications.

- Recognizes individuals who contribute annual gifts of \$10,000 or more
- Established in 1987 and is one of the strongest in the country
- 63 members donated more than \$1.42 million in 2017 – 19% of United Way of Greater Stark County's annual campaign.

The Step Up to Alexis de Tocqueville program allows donors to begin giving at \$5,000 and be recognized locally and nationally as a Tocqueville Society member while increasing their gift over a five year period to reach \$10,000.

INCORPORATING LEADERSHIP GIVING Becoming a United Way of Greater Stark County Leadership Giver is a gift to our community that means so much to so many. Leadership Givers collectively help thousands of local people every year. Inviting your company's givers to join at the leadership level increases the number of those helped even more while developing camaraderie among employees, providing opportunity for team recognition and building excitement around the campaign.

ORGANIZING A LEADERSHIP GIVING PROGRAM

Incorporating a Leadership Giving campaign is one of the best ways to increase the success of your campaign and encourage employee engagement. Here are some steps to success:

1. Gain CEO or top management support.
2. Host an event to encourage and ask for participation at the leadership level. Events or activities can be geared towards specific demographics, such as Women United, Young Leaders Society and/or Labor CARES.
3. Hold a special event to thank those who give at the leadership level by having your CEO speak, provide lunch or give employees a denim day.
4. Ask Leadership Givers for their support prior to the start of campaign. This allows company leaders to set the pace for the campaign.
5. Have your CEO or Leadership support team make one-on-one requests.*
6. Have the CEO send personal thank you letters.*
7. Visibly recognize your Leadership Givers throughout the organization.
8. Allow United Way to recognize your Leadership Givers through our various societies.
(Send us a list of your Leadership Givers so we can properly recognize and thank them!)

*Ask your United Way of Greater Stark County campaign representative for sample emails, letters, talking points, etc.
DONOR NETWORKS offer donors the opportunity to join groups based on their interests and/or giving level.



LEADERS IN GIVING CAMPAIGN TIMELINE

TARGET DATE	TASK COMPLETED	BEFORE THE CAMPAIGN
6-8 weeks prior		Obtain support of your CEO and discuss Leaders in Giving campaign plans/activities
4-6 weeks prior		Recruit a team to assist you <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Depending on the number of prospects, one person may not be sufficient to effectively visit each donor • Involving others will lead to increased and improved leadership participation • Add someone from your management team to help make a peer-to-peer ask
4-6 weeks prior		Utilize your UWGSC Representative to assist with planning <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn more about United Way's campaign initiatives and Leaders in Giving program • Review and discuss Leaders in Giving campaign plans/activities • Review previous years' results and leadership activities • Develop preliminary dollar and member goals
2-4 weeks prior		Prepare a prospect list <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify prospects and appropriate level of "ask" • Personalize each pledge card • Assign prospect names to campaign team members (if applicable)
1-2 weeks prior		Finalize Leadership Giving goals (dollars and number of donors)
2 weeks prior		Determine method(s) of solicitation <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One-on-One ask • Group meeting(s) • CEO letter or combination of the above • UWGSC can assist with group meetings by providing PSA and/or guest speakers
1 week prior		Send endorsement letter from CEO to all Leaders in Giving prospects

TARGET DATE	TASK COMPLETED	BEFORE THE CAMPAIGN
Within 1-2 weeks		Conduct solicitation (One-on-One ask, Group meeting(s) and/or CEO Letter)
Within 1-2 weeks		Continue solicitation until each Leadership prospect has been asked to contribute <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Follow up with colleagues until all pledge cards are received • Answer any questions • Report campaign status to your United Way representative

TARGET DATE	TASK COMPLETED	BEFORE THE CAMPAIGN
1 week		Tally Leadership Giving contributions
1-2 weeks		Share results with your CEO, co-workers and your UWGSC Representative
1-2 weeks		Personally thank your donors. Options include: thank you letter, special breakfast, lunch or dinner for donors, paid vacation or personal day, etc
Upon Campaign Completion		Complete paperwork for Leadership Giving and submit results to your UWGSC Representative
