Create awareness of, provide educational programs, and institutionalize safe sleep policies and practices.


# Upstream Intervention: CenteringPregnancy® Prenatal Care and Community-based Care Coordination







Using the past 4 years of data only met goal once! (2011)




Using the past 4 years of data Stark County has met or exceeded the Healthy People goal consistently!

Non-Hispanic Black births contribute an average of 11.5% of total births. This is also our goal for Non-Hispanic Black percentage of infant deaths. This goal has not been met.


Statistically significant differences are seen in preterm birth rate between races in 2011 and 2013 only.

\* indicates a statistically significant difference in rates between races.




# Statistically significant differences in low birth rate are seen between races in 2010, 2011, 2102, 2013.


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
Stark County's disparity rate for birth indicators, preterm and low birth weight.





### Safe Sleep

- Safe Sleep marketing countywide distribution of floor talkers and changing table stickers
- Safe Sleep Tool-kit Distribution began January 2016
- Stark County Health Department conducting training for agencies to provide Safe Sleep Survival Kits
- Hospitals adopted and modeling safe sleep policies per Ohio law as enacted by Ohio Am. Sub. S.B. 276 of the 130th General Assembly. Designing audit tool for hospitals to monitor compliance.



# CenteringPregnancy® Model and Care Coordination Goal: Link pregnant women to early prenatal care!

- Partnering with hospital Centering programs
- Referrals to Care Coordinator for assistance with enrollment, transportation, and other needed services
- Outreach efforts including Health fairs, Hispanic Community Conversation, Martin Luther King Jr. Celebration, KidFest
- Pregnancy Choices pregnancy group education pilot program
