Project Blueprint

FOR DIVERSITY, EQUITY AND INCLUSION

WHAT IS PROJECT BLUEPRINT?

This unique program prepares emerging and current volunteers leaders in our BIPOC community and trains them to enter into policy-making roles in order to enhance the effectiveness of nonprofit agencies.

VOLUNTEER LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

- Trains participants to serve effectively by providing the knowledge, skills, experiences and confidence essential to these roles.
- Offers the opportunity to learn skills to be sought out for leadership roles on board and committees

This 10-week course provides training for passionate, interested and engaged members of the community to serve on nonprofit & public-sector boards and committees. Training requires continuous learning, and a participant's willingness to explore the unfamiliar and an openness to new experiences.

The program consists of a series of training sessions and activities that introduce participants to the roles and responsibilities of volunteer leadership, while developing skills which help them become successful board and committee members.

Project Blueprint's main goal is to ensure that local volunteer leadership on boards and committees is representative of the community and that diverse perspectives are included in the decision-making process. African Americans, Asians, Hispanics, Native Americans, and other racial minorities will become a greater voice in Stark and Carroll Counties through training and placement in positions of influence.



IDEAL CANDIDATE

- A culturally and ethnically diverse professional or community leader with the desire to accept a volunteer leadership role at a nonprofit
- Demonstrated interest in community engagement
- Committed to weekly attendance, which is required for board certification and recommendation

CLASSES

10-week training program every Thursday during the session period from 4:30 - 6:30 PM at United Way of Greater Stark County.

The sessions help build skills and educate participants about the community's issues and resources.
