HOMELESSNESS

Stark County Homeless Navigation Hotline - 330-452-4363

Conducts all intakes for Stark County homeless services for those who are homeless or will become homeless within seven days. Open Monday - Friday 8:30 am-4 pm. Over-the-phone intake may take up to one hour to complete.

Note: Shelter space may not be available immediately. Families with children are prioritized. Those who are on the prioritization list should call if there are any changes in their situation or if their contact information changes.

CAR REPAIRS

Partnership between United Way and Stark County Department of Job & Family Services to help employed parents who need help with car repairs to get back on the road. The program offers up to \$1,500 in assistance to pay for services performed by ASE-certified mechanics.

- Must be currently employed or enrolled in college full time
- Must be age 18 or older
- Must have minor child in the home or pay child support for minor child

TAX PREPARATION ASSISTANCE

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program (VITA) – 330-994-8482 or uwstark.org/VITA

VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance) is a free service from United Way of Greater Stark County that helps households with lower income get their tax returns completed by an IRS certified preparer. Tax Assistance is available January thru April each year. Services are provided to Stark, Carroll, and Tuscarawas County residents.

- Individual income must be under \$60,000 per year
