homas A. Schauer always has believed the key to building and sustaining a successful business is commitment – to clients, to associates, and to the entire community. These principles guided his time at the helm of his risk management firm, Schauer Group, and they have been evident in his dedicated service to the community throughout his life.

Tom grew up in Canton, graduating from McKinley High School in 1945. He then attended The Ohio State University, while also serving several years with the U.S. Navy. After earning a degree in insurance, he returned home to Canton to assist his mother in running the family's insurance agency.

By 1953, Tom had purchased the business from his mother and began to shift the company from focusing solely on door-to-door insurance sales to providing clients with risk management expertise. Quickly, the two-person insurance agency became one of the largest in the city.

For Tom, it was paramount to invest back into the Stark County community as his business grew.

"We live and work in a wonderful community created by our forebearers," he said. "In order to keep it that way, we need to give back to our community in every way that we can."

Tom's community service involvement has spanned dozens of organizations, including leadership roles with the Aultman Hospital Board of Trustees, the Aultman Health Foundation, the Distribution Committee of the Stark Community Foundation, the Canton Area YMCA Board of Trustees, the Canton Club, the United Way of Central Stark County, the Better Business Bureau, the Community Blood Program, the North Nimishillen District of the Boy Scouts of America, the Avondale Community Improvement Association, and the Stark County Accident and Health Underwriters.

During his career, Tom also chaired fundraising campaigns for the Canton Area YMCA, the United Way of Central Stark County, and Malone College. He has been the recipient of the Gold Key Service Award from the United Way, the Award of Merit from the Greater Canton Chamber of Commerce and the Red Triangle Award from the YMCA.

Tom is being honored by his sons, Bill Schauer and David Schauer, who have continued his legacy of giving back to the community that has supported the family's business for more than 100 years. Today, commitment remains one of the company's core values and is shared by all Schauer Group associates.

"Our father's unwavering commitment to the Northeastern Ohio community, our clients and our associates has been the cornerstone of our business success," David said.

"He taught us that being a responsible member of the community is an important part of running a successful business, and his commitment to giving back has set an excellent example for our family and all Schauer Group associates," Bill continued.

The Yoders credit their faith for their success in life and business. They are devout Christians and have always been active in their church community. They credited their faith for guiding them in their decisions and for helping them to overcome the many challenges they faced along the way.

Family has also been a cornerstone of their lives. They have four children, eleven grandchildren, and an ever growing branch of great-grandchildren. Family holidays and gatherings are filled with joy, laughter, and delicious homemade cooking.

Their generosity extends beyond their family. They have always been committed to charitable giving and have supported many causes over the years. Congressman Ralph and Mary Regula

Education was always a top priority for the Congressman. He was integral in the creation of NEOUCOM Medical School and Stark State College of Technology. Mary was an avid speaker on women's issues, U.S. history, and First Ladies. She founded the First Ladies' Library on Market Street in downtown Canton. Congressman Ralph and Mary Regula were honored by Bob and Linda DeHoff.



Herbert Schalmo
