SENATOR KIRK SCHURING HONORED BY: BOB AND LINDA DEHOFF

enator Kirk Schuring was more than a statesman — he was a steady hand, a thoughtful mentor, and a beloved friend to many in Stark County and beyond. With over 30 years of public service in both the Ohio House of Representatives and the Ohio Senate, Kirk devoted his life to improving the lives of others. He held numerous leadership positions during his tenure, including Speaker Pro Tempore of the Ohio House, Interim Speaker of the Ohio House, and President Pro Tempore of the **Ohio Senate** — roles that reflected the deep trust and respect he earned from his colleagues on both sides of the aisle.

Born and raised in Canton, Kirk's roots ran deep in the community he so proudly served. He graduated from Perry High School and Kent State University before joining his family's insurance agency — a place where he honed his skills in leadership, fairness, and building relationships. These early experiences shaped the way he approached politics: always with an open mind, a collaborative spirit, and a genuine desire to help.

Throughout his distinguished career, Kirk never lost sight of the people behind the policies. Whether he was crafting legislation to boost economic development, expand healthcare access, or modernize Ohio's workforce, he always focused on creating real, lasting change. He played a pivotal role in establishing Joint Economic Development Districts and advancing school safety legislation. His leadership helped pass the Ohio Film Tax Credit and legalize sports gaming — achievements that spurred economic growth and created new opportunities across the state.



Kirk was also deeply engaged with his hometown. He served as president of the Canton Jaycees, the Canton Urban League, and the Canton Club, and was active with the Pro Football Hall of Fame and the Canton Regional Chamber of Commerce. But more than any title or award, what Kirk cherished most were the connections he made – the young leaders he inspired, the families he uplifted, the colleagues he mentored, and above all, the deep, unwavering love he held for his own family. His beloved wife, Darlene, along with their children and grandchildren, stood by his side and remained at the heart of everything he did.

Those who knew Kirk remember his integrity, quiet strength, and unwavering optimism. He believed that government should work for the people and that meaningful progress came through patience, respect, and hard work. He didn't seek the spotlight — he simply showed up, day after day, ready to make a difference.

Senator Schuring's passing on November 22, 2024, left a profound void in the hearts of many. But his legacy lives on — not just in the laws he helped pass or the policies he shaped, but in the countless lives he touched with his kindness, generosity, and vision for a stronger, more united community.
